From the Pastor's Keyboard...

"Church: Next"

Last month I wrote about the Annual Spring Convocation & Brueggemann/Kulenkamp lectures at Eden Seminary. The guests at the lectures were three prominent Theologians, all of whom talked about "The Emerging Church"- how the church is evolving into something completely different in the modern day cycle of life. Their theory is that every 500 years or so, the church undergoes a "metamorphosis." What emerges is something even truer to the witness of our faith than what it replaces. The church is undergoing one such "emergence" right now.

There are three great questions that are part of this Emergence; and these great questions are fundamental to the developing incarnation of faith into which the church is currently evolving. These questions are not ones that can be answered easily; as they require soul searching and discernment to even grasp the aspect of the question, let alone the answer. However, these are questions societies are struggling with as the Emerging Church develops.

The first question is one that we need to struggle with as a church. "What is my Theology of Religion?" What a doozy. It is asking, "What do I really believe?" As the Emerging Church develops and unfolds in our world, folks are asking what they really believe about God, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, Salvation, Eschatology, Judgment, Heaven and Hell, Our Mission as Christians, etc. For 400 years or so, societies have been parroting the Creeds and Critiques of the Reformation Scholars and others; but for the Emerging Church, this is not enough. It is up to us to define and articulate our own faith; to truly develop what it is we believe. In our world, we live in dialogue with other faiths all the time; and most of them are adept at articulating what they believe. If we cannot articulate our own faith, how can we be in dialogue with others? A lack of articulation has caused some to simply withdraw from any faith at all. As the church emerges into something new, this needs to shift.

FLOODING CONTINUES IN TENNESSEE

As rainfall subsides and floodwaters recede, monetary relief is beginning to flow into Tennessee, where 52 of the state's 95 counties have been declared eligible for emergency funding.

"We don't have a good count yet for the number of homes affected," says Florence Coppola, UCC executive minister for Disaster Ministries, "but local communities are getting organized. Immediate money is available for housing rentals, which is great." At least 28 deaths have been attributed to recent storms and flooding in the Southeast, including 19 in Tennessee.

UCC disaster response representative Connie Waidman, a long-term volunteer at Back Bay Mission in Biloxi, Mississippi is working with the UCC's Southeast Conference team to plan best steps in assisting flood victims. "We're sending out personal-protection equipment for homeowners and volunteers to use when cleaning out their homes," says Coppola. "I'm sure there will be people uninsured or underinsured. A lot of them don't have flood insurance because they don't live in a flood plain."

On May 4, the Cumberland River, which flows through Nashville, was at 51.8 feet – 11.8 feet above flood stage, according to the National Weather Service. While the Grand Ole Opry has sustained damage and a few high-profile entertainers have incurred loss, Coppola says televised news coverage of the flood paints only a swath of the bigger picture. "Those aren't the people who are going to need the assistance," says Coppola. "Please don't look at that as all that's happened. What viewers aren't seeing are the homes of the people."

The United Church of Christ, through our Disaster Relief Ministries, is working to provide relief for the flooding in Tennessee; and has been in solidarity with the victims of the flooding since it began. The United Church of Christ is supplying hygiene materials, food, supplies and shelter for those in need. This ministry is made possible through gifts to the ***Bem Church Mission Fund*** and ***Our Church's Wider Mission***. When you give to ***The Mission Fund***, 85% of it goes to ***Our Church's Wider Mission***, the work of our denomination where the "rubber meets the road". Remember those in need every Sunday through ***Our Church's Wider Mission!***

Lydia's House is one of the missions Bem Church supports through our Mission of the Month program. We recently received their annual report and wanted to share with you the results of your support:

With the help of our donors and volunteers, Lydia's House provided transitional housing and critical support services to 133 domestic violence survivors (50 women and 83 children) during the fiscal year 2009 including:

- 27,546 nights of safety
- 3493 individual advocacy sessions
- 84 women's support groups
- 99 children's support groups
- 100 community meals and social activities

NEW SUNDAY SCHOOL PROGRAM TO BEGIN- ROCK SOLID!

The Christian Education Committee has decided to begin a new curriculum next fall with a new Sunday School program called, "Rock Solid!" This program is published by Cokesbury and features curriculum for all ages from preschool on up to high school. We will be focusing on the preschool through fifth grade classes with this curriculum.

In this program, each class has handouts and exercises based on the Biblical theme of the day. The courses are divided into 13-week installments; and each installment is separated into three different units. The units reflect the theme of the season, and the faith journey the church is currently partaking.

We will be soliciting classroom leaders this summer. At present time, there are plans for four teams (pre-k, K-1, 2-3 and 4-5) although this could change once we examine our enrollment and run a few models. For each team, we will be soliciting a core of leadership that will rotate among themselves the responsibility for each individual Sunday. We may be asking you to be a part of the team!

WHO IS GOD?

ELECTRONIC GIVING IS ALL SET UP!

St. John's, Bem United Church of Christ is on-line with e-Give! To set up your weekly gift (or monthly, or whatever you choose) go to www.egive-usa.com and follow the prompts on screen. On the "givers" side of the page, click on the link that says, "Sign Up Today" and follow the prompts. The whole process takes about 15 minutes or so to navigate; be sure to read the directions! If you have any problems setting this up, you can contact the church office for assistance. (You can always change or cancel your giving amount if you find that this service does not suit your individual stewardship practices.)

This tool is optional; for folks who do not want to participate in electronic giving, that is just fine, too! We felt it beneficial to provide this option for folks who are interested, so they can avail themselves of the opportunity.

Is this as faithful as putting money in the plate when it is passed at church? Certainly. Whether you choose to put your money in the plate when it is passed, or choose to set up a continuous gift with e-give, **-or choose to do both-** you are making a promise of faith and acting upon it. Faithful stewardship takes on many forms and is enacted in many ways; electronic giving is just one of them.

For those who would like to participate in electronic giving but would also like to put something in the plate on Sunday, how about taking your offering envelope and writing, "I gave online" on it; then place it in the plate as a symbol of the faithful stewardship you are practicing! This may sound redundant to some; but putting our offering in the plate is an important action; part of who we are as Christians; living that action while giving on line is important as well.

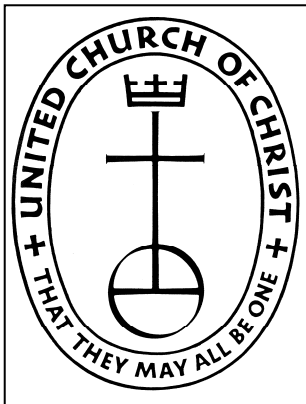
