From the Pastor's Keyboard...

"Freedom"

The following devotional was emailed to me recently from our UCC Writer's Group Daily Devotional Service; a free service of the United Church of Christ supported by our contributions to Our Church's Wider Mission. I found it to be particularly meaningful as we contemplate freedom during this month of Independence Day Celebrations. What does it mean to be free? Free for what? Free from what?

"...Then Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." They answered him, "We are descendants of Abraham and have never been slaves to anyone. What do you mean by saying, 'You will be made free.?' " Jesus answered them, "Very truly, I tell you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin." -John 8:31-34

Reflection by Quinn G. Caldwell

To what are you enslaved? What forces, institutions, people direct your energy and productivity without your consent? What are the drives, the needs, the addictions that control who you are and what you do? From what do you long to be freed?

Jesus says that the truth of God as revealed in him has the power to free them from sin. I believe that to be true, but I think Jesus was being a little too modest. I think the truth of God in Christ has the power not just to free us from sin, which is anything that separates us from God. I think it also has the power to free us from sins which separate us from ourselves, and from one another; things like addiction, hatred, selfishness and fear—forces that enslave and separate. (Sins)

One of the ways God sets this power free in the world is the church. In the church, at its imperfect best, we are reminded by good people as fragile and messed up as we are of our heritage as beloved children of the Creator of the Universe, heirs to the promises of God. We are reminded that God longs to be in control of our lives, and that we will be better—and freer—if we let it happen..."

The church, as imperfect as it is, is one place we can experience 'freedom'- the right to choose our own 'slavery'. Who/what rules/dictates your life? To what/whom are you enslaved? Whom will you serve?

BEM CHURCH IS ACTIVE IN GUATEMALA

“For as we share abundantly in Christ's sufferings, so through Christ we share abundantly in comfort too.” - II Corinthians 1: 5

From United Church of Christ Missionary Gloria Vincente, in Guatemala:

“There are a few "commodities" and "luxuries" our family had in Chicago which we no longer have, relatively speaking, here in El Quiche, Guatemala. For example, having access to potable (drinking & cooking) water is not only a national problem, but for our area has been a years-long problem. The water truck drives down our street as early as 6 am every day of the week honking the horn and selling water. We buy our water this way. It is then stored in cisterns where the already murky water gets even murkier. Some days I wish I could submerge myself in Lake Michigan to bathe - I miss it!

“Having access to potable water is not only a social problem but also an environmental one. There have been mild droughts each of the recent years, but in the past year throughout most of Guatemala and much of Central America, there was no rainfall whatsoever. Now the government has officially announced a severe drought. The drought destroyed most of next year's subsistence maize (corn) crops, and the cost of maize has increased astronomically. Not only is there a lack of food for the upcoming year, but this has created a serious economic hardship for most families. While historically, many rural residents have been internally displaced, or uprooted from their communities due to colonialism, the 36 year old armed conflict and the recent mining business, now many are being displaced due to grave environmental changes. (lack of water) Yet there is something impressive about an organization like *Guatemalan Cultural Action (ACG)* which has a staff so committed and dedicated to improving the lives of each person in the community, even while living with their own economic hardships.

Pray with me, giving thanks to God for the *Guatemalan Cultural Action (ACG)*. May God bless you and your family in everything you do to support me and my family and the *ACG*. I humbly ask for your continued prayers.

Gloria Vicente serves as a United Church of Christ/Disciples of Christ Global Ministries Missionary, in mission with *Guatemalan Culture Action (ACG)* as a youth and communication worker. The United Church of Christ, through our Global Ministries Missionaries, is working to be Christ's hands and feet all over the world, including Guatemala. Gloria's work helps provide education and relief, a hand up to those in need. This ministry is made possible through gifts to the *Bem Church Mission Fund* and *Our Church's Wider Mission*. When you give to *The Mission Fund*, 85% of it goes to *Our Church's Wider Mission*, the work of our denomination where the “rubber meets the road”. Remember those in need every Sunday through *Our Church's Wider Mission!*

Our own Lindsey Mercer spent two weeks in Guatemala earlier this year as well, providing aid and volunteering at a hospital. Lindsey has spoken in church about this mission; talk to her one Sunday if you are interested in hearing more! Bem Church is in action all over the world through our own service, and through our covenanted ministries in the United Church of Christ!

The ***Strengthen the Church*** offering helps spread the love to ***United Church of Christ*** churches and members by renewing churches, enabling youth and young adult ministries, and providing avenues for lay and pastoral leadership formation all across the ***United Church of Christ***.

Wollaston Congregational United Church of Christ in the Massachusetts Conference is one of the miracle stories enabled by spreading the love through our ***Strengthen the Church*** offerings. Back in 2003 it looked like Wollaston would close. It had dwindled from 900 members to only 25. Thanks to our ***Strengthen the Church*** offerings, a “new church in an old building” has been birthed. The newly revitalized church is now well known in the community for its children’s outreach: Healthy Kids Vacation Camp; Super Kids Saturdays; Family Fun Nights. They have grown a new heart for the mission field right in their own neighborhood and are designated an “Intentional Turnaround Church” by their Conference.

Kirkwood UCC in a suburb of Atlanta, Georgia was another miracles story enabled by spreading the love through our ***Strengthen the Church*** offerings. Kirkwood UCC began in a coffee shop in this Atlanta suburb; now they have their own worship space, with a lively, family-themed worship service each Sunday at 5:00pm and a more traditional service on Sunday mornings. Their start up was enabled by our ***Strengthen the Church*** offerings!

Our support of ***Strengthen the Church*** is an important way to spread our love all over the UCC. In 2008 we raised \$392 for our ***Strengthen the Church*** offering. Can we meet or exceed that this year? Give generously in July to this special Mission of the Month!

NEW SUNDAY SCHOOL PROGRAM TO BEGIN- ROCK SOLID!

The Christian Education Committee has decided to begin a new curriculum next fall with a new Sunday School program called, “Rock Solid!” This program is published by Cokesbury and features curriculum for all ages from preschool on up to high school. We will be focusing on the preschool through fifth grade classes with this curriculum.

In this program, each class has handouts and exercises based on the Biblical theme of the day. The courses are divided into 13-week installments; and each installment is separated into three different units. The units reflect the theme of the season, and the faith journey the church is currently partaking.

We will be soliciting classroom leaders this summer. At present time, there are plans for four teams (pre-k, K-1, 2-3 and 4-5) although this could change once we examine our enrollment and run a few models. For each team, we will be soliciting a core of leadership that will rotate among themselves the responsibility for each individual Sunday. We may be asking you to be a part of the team!

Watch for more details from the Christian Education Committee, or talk to Suzan Wilson, chair. This will be an exciting program! Come be a part of it!

WHO IS JESUS?

Who is Jesus? We use a lot of colorful language to talk about Jesus; we call him the “Son of God” and the “Prince of Peace” and the “Son of Man” and the “Blood of the Lamb.” What do all of these platitudes mean? Moreover, what do we really believe about the entire crucifixion event? What happened there, and how did that make sense? Was it a transaction, or a revelation? What is it that we really believe? Who is Jesus?

As we live in a world that is more pluralistic all the time (many cultures and faiths living together), how can we interact with other faiths if we cannot articulate our own?

Each Sunday in July, we will examine different aspects of Jesus’ existence, including: “Leader” “Teacher” “Central to our Faith” and “Conduit to God.” Come be a part of the discussion!

We will be considering the nature of the Holy Spirit and the Church in August. Let us learn our faith together and be able to articulate it when asked! *“Who is Jesus?”*

MISSOURI MID-SOUTH CONFERENCE ANNUAL GATHERING

The Annual Gathering of the Missouri Mid-South Conference was held June 11-13, 2010 at Drury University in Springfield, MO. What an exciting gathering it was! We heard some captivating presentations from David Greenhaw, President of Eden Seminary. He led worship Friday evening, delivered a keynote address, and led us in a Bible Study Saturday morning. His message concerned how we are all strangers sojourning in the world, and examined how we deal with the stranger in our midst every day.

The business of the meeting involved passage of new by-laws for the Missouri Mid-South Conference, reflecting our change in structure. We elected 15 people to our inaugural Conference Council, part of the new change in structure. (*Jamie Schultz was elected to this new Conference Council!*) We also elected General Synod delegates (*Faye Howard was elected as a delegate to General Synod!*) and representatives to other United Church of Christ institutions. We approved passage of amendments to the United Church of Christ National by-laws, reflecting language changes regarding students discerning their call to seminary; and we approved the formation of a relationship between the Missouri Mid-South Conference and the Community of the Disciples of Christ in the Bokungu Region of the Congo.

Other speakers and presentations were celebrated as well, including an address to the gathering from Rev. Norbert Stephens, The Regional Deputy Secretary of our partner churches in Jamaica. Meaningful and inspiring worship rounded out the weekend, making it a moving time for all.

Perhaps the most meaningful part of the weekend, though was being in communion with our partners from UCC churches all over the state of Missouri. Gathered together from many places with one faith heritage joining us was inspirational in itself. Attending this gathering helps one to grasp the reality of the covenant partnership we share.

Next year’s Conference Annual Gathering will be June 10-12, again at Drury University in Springfield. Besides the Pastor, Bem Church is allocated two delegates, plus one youth delegate; and as many visitors as would like to attend. Interested? Mark your calendars now and talk to Pastor Rick!

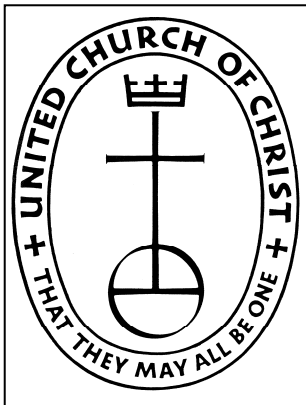
